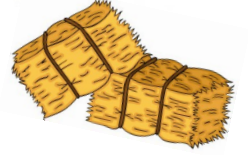
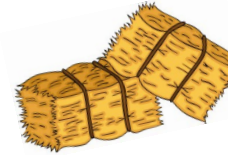

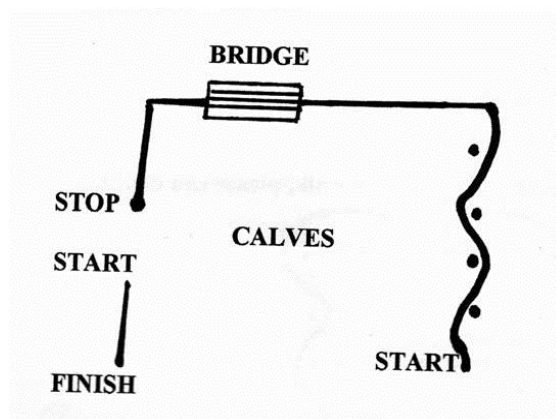

## GUIDELINES FOR CALVES

The Judge will be looking for the following things:

- Your calf must be led on your right hand side
- Both hands should be on the lead rope throughout the course and your calf should walk beside you like friends, not behind or ahead of you
- Does your calf lead without being pushed or pulled through the obstacle course which will have a zigzag, a bridge to walk over, a stopping point where you will pause then continue walking



The Judge may also ask you some or all of these questions:

- When your calf was born / how old is your calf?
- What do you feed your calf - i.e. milk, meal/pellets, hay?
- What time / how often do you feed your calf?
- How much do you feed your calf?
- What breed is your calf?

You should also make sure that your calf is nice and clean. It should be well brushed, have clean ears, tail and bottom, and make sure it's feet are clean and polished with a cloth.

Please remember to bring a bucket along so your calf has plenty of water to drink on Ag Day.

## GUIDELINES FOR OTHER PETS

(Pets are shown at the hall)

Children are required to be with their pet when judged, so they are able to answer questions the judge asks them.

The judge may ask you some or all of these questions:

- How long have you had your pet?
- How old is it?
- When do you feed your pet?
- What do you feed your pet?
- What breed/type is it?
- What special things do you have to do with/for your pet to keep it healthy?
- Does it require any injections? If so, what for?
- What is the best thing you like to do with your pet?
- Why do you love your pet?
- Are there any tricks your pet can show the judge?

The purpose is to find out how much time is spent with the animal and how much of a pet it is. The judge will also be looking at the general health and well-being of the pet.

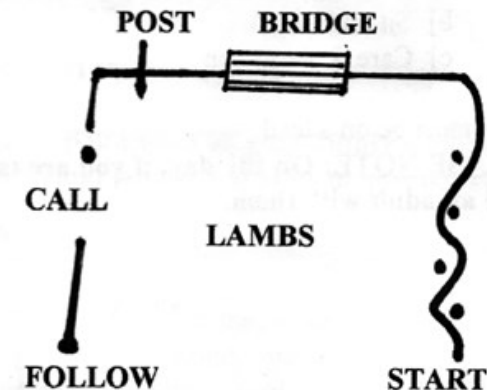
You should also make sure that your pet is looking fit and well, and that is in a clean and tidy cage. You should groom your pet to the best of your ability.

Please remember to bring a bowl or bucket along so that your pet has plenty of water to drink on Ag Day.

## GUIDELINES FOR LAMBS

The Judge will be looking for the following things:

- Your lamb must be led on your right hand side
- Does your lamb lead without being pushed or dragged through the obstacle course which will have a zigzag, a bridge to walk over, a post to jump over
- Does your lamb come to you when you call his/her name?
- Will your lamb follow you?



The Judge may also ask you some or all of these questions:

- When was your lamb born / how old is your lamb?
- What do you feed your lamb?
- What time / how often do you feed your lamb?
- How much do you feed your lamb?
- What breed is your lamb?
- What do you do with your lamb when you play with him/her?

You should also make sure that your lamb is nice and clean. You can brush it to get a lovely looking coat, clean it's ears and tail with a damp cloth. You must not wash your lamb because the lanoline that protects the lamb from rain and bad weather comes out of the wool.

Please remember to give your lamb lots of water to drink on Ag Day.

## GUIDELINES FOR KID GOATS

The Judge will be looking for the following things:

- Your kid must be led on your right hand side
- Does your kid lead without being pushed or dragged through the obstacle course which will have a zigzag, a bridge to walk over, a post to jump over
- Does your kid come to you when you call his/her name?
- Will your kid follow you?

### Leading

This event is now undertaken around an obstacle course. See Figure Seven and Eight below.

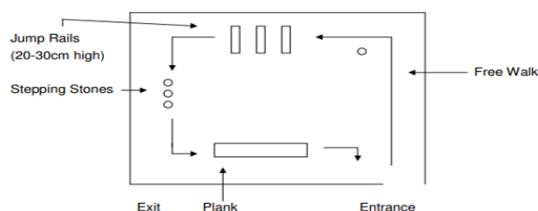


Figure Seven: Obstacle Course for Kid Goat

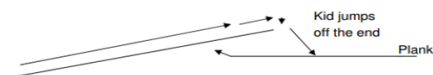


Figure Eight: The Plank

The child walks with the kid, staying on the outside of the obstacles. The child is not permitted to climb over the obstacles or to assist the kid on to them.

The judge may also ask you some or all of these questions:

- When was your kid born / how old is your kid?
- What do you feed your kid?
- What time / how often do you feed your kid?
- How much do you feed your kid?
- What breed is your kid?
- What do you do with your kid when you play with him/her?

You should also make sure that your kid is nice and clean. You can clean it's ears, tail and bottom with a damp cloth. Dairy goat kids can be brushed, however Angora goat kids can only be brushed very lightly to remove any loose hair.

Please remember to give your kid lots of water to drink on Ag Day.

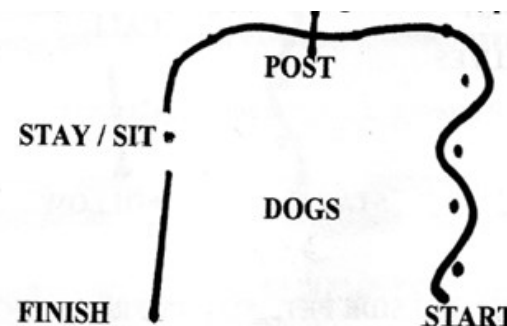
## GUIDELINES FOR DOGS

No dangerous breeds ie; Pit Bulls. **All dogs must be on a lead and tied up when not in the judging ring.** Dogs are to be 6 months or older. If your dog is under 6 months old, it will be entered in the 'Other Pets' section. All dogs must have a current registration and vet passport, produced at registration. Dogs should be wormed within three weeks of Ag Day.

All children entering a dog or puppy will be given a "doggy do" bag. These bags must be used to clean up after your dog.

The Judge will be looking for the following things:

- Your dog must be socialised and used to being away from home and/or farm
- Your dog should be led willingly through the obstacle course which will have a zigzag, bridge to walk over, and a post to jump over
- At the standard you will ask your dog to 'sit and stay', while you move a short distance away
- You will then call your dog - the dog must stay sitting until called by you.
- You may want to show the judges a trick that your dog can do



The Judge may also ask you some or all of these questions:

- How old is your dog?
- When do you feed your dog?
- What do you feed your dog?
- What breed is it?
- What do you do with your dog when you play with it?

You should also make sure that your dog is nice and clean. You can brush it so it's coat is clean and shiny, and you could give it a bath so it even smells clean. Make sure your dog is fit and healthy.

Please remember to give your dog lots of water to drink on Ag Day.
