Tasks

Concrete paint marking renewed. Lines painted in carpark to be confirmed

Soccer nets to be put up

School field sports markings need to be painted

Hedges trimmed

Gardens weeded/native area and driveway

Shrubs to be pruned in central garden in front of hall/senior studio

Wooden garden edging in central garden to be restapled & tidied

Prune roses

Shrubs to be planted along hall garden (to match front of office)

Sweep up leaves and remove the ferns growing through the hall base boards

Weed eating around the edge of buildings

Clean all spouting

After gardens have been weeded, put mulch around gardens and fruit trees
