From the Principal's Desk

Greetings to parents and members of the Marotiri School Community.

Congratulations to everyone who helped make our Agricultural Day such a success. I would like to extend an enormous thank you, to the members of our Ag Day organisation committee who worked diligently to organise judges, stewards and sponsors, secure raffle and auction items, and put together thank you gift baskets for our judges and stewards. While this has been a huge team effort, Sarah Walters deserves special mention as our cool, calm and extremely competent coordinator. workshop was followed by a parent information evening. Joce has conducted assessments on a number of our students. Both the staff meeting and parent information evening were well attended and most informative. A power point of the parent presentation will be uploaded to our website shortly.

As a Board, we are currently reviewing our school charter. As part of this process we are seeking parent feedback on the aspirations and needs of our community; what you want from our school, what you think we do well, what we could do differently and what you feel our students need in order to be well prepared for the next stage in their learning. 
Distribution of the Marotiri Messenger


Marotiri School Livestock Scheme




