Kia ora Koutou,

Greetings to parents and members of the Marotiri School Community,

Happy Easter everyone. I trust you managed to take a little time out from the business of life to enjoy some family time together and perhaps an Easter egg or two. We have two more weeks of school before Term One finishes on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> April. Excitement is building for our trail ride on the first Saturday of the holidays. 
