From the Principal's Desk

Wednesday 15th September 2021 Week 8 Term 3

Kia ora Koutou,

Dear Parents and Whanau.

This week we recognise Maori Language Week. Students are practising Te Reo phrases, daily greetings and instructions.

What unusual times we find ourselves in once again. As we returned to Alert level 2, our thoughts remain with our compatriots in Auckland who are not so fortunate.

The Marotiri community never fails to impress with the resilience and support for one another, whether it be your commitment to overseeing children's distance learning programmes amidst the demands of farming in the spring, or surviving the challenge of working from home while sharing devices and attempting to minimise the impact Covid is having on your business. Our thoughts are with those families who have found the latest Lock Down particularly challenging. Please remember if there is anything we can do to help, or if you simply need someone to chat to, the kettle is always hot, and we are here for you.

A drop to Alert 2 last week meant school life, for the most part, returned to normal albeit with a renewed focus on stringent hygiene practice, staggered break times to reduce playground congregation, well ventilated classrooms, and a chance to catch up once again with friends. Our focus for the remainder of the term is on reestablishing childrens' routines and ensuring each class is immersed in focussed learning programmes.

Under Alert 2, the restrictions on gatherings mean sporting events such as the Pinelands Cross Country have been cancelled and Kiwi sports taster sessions rescheduled. Thank you to Barry and Di Grattan for the use of your farm paddocks for Cross Country training prior to Lock down. We now look forward to a focus on preparing for athletics next term.

Our school production - 'Korero Tuku Iho:Tuwharetoa - Stories of

the Past' has been postponed until 1 December, by which time we hope to be back in Alert Level 1. In the meantime Toni Neve from Act II Performing Arts School, will continue working with classes to finalise scripts and design soundscapes.

For the rest of the term, each class will be focused on preparing their Ag Day arts and crafts. This year, there is to be a family competition for the 'best' 'Wind Chime', so start planning now! We encourage all students to bring along pets, either lambs, calves, dogs, or other pets. There will also be floral and baking competitions.

The Tuwharetoa Kapa Haka festival has also been postponed at this stage until late November. Alert Level 1 is necessary to permit the large numbers to gather safely. Dates will be confirmed shortly. Matua Grant will continue working with students each Thursday afternoon.

In finishing, I would like to give everyone the heads up, that it is time to dust off those saddles in preparation for this year's Marotiri School Horse Trek, planned for the first weekend in November. More information will follow before long, but in the meantime I extend my thanks to Louette Breingan. for again coordinating this year's event. Registrations will be called for along with more information once plans have been finalised.

AG DAY TROPHIES-Can all 2020 AG Day Trophies be returned to the school office.



Accidents & Emergencies

The Marotiri District Defibrillator is located in a Red Cross box next to the entrance of the Hall on the school side. Please familiarise yourselves with this location.

The Defibrillator or AED is a self-explanatory device which could save a life if activated quickly enough.

Also, it is important to note that once you ring 111, you are 'locked in' to the emergency services and prevented from using that particular phone until the ambulance or helicopter arrives.

Therefore if you are on your own, you have 2 main options;

- Ring a neighbour or the school first (providing it's a school day) before ringing 111
- Or if possible, use 2 phones (cell phone and landline) as both can be used at once. This of course will depend on your location at the time, i.e. on the roadside or the farm or at home.

Tihoi Venture School has available an Emergency Kit that includes Oxygen, Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose, Nebuliser for asthma, Trauma Kit, Airway management and a defibrillator. All staff are trained First Aiders and can assist. Callum's contact is 021 029 31513 if no reply on 07 3728 416.

It has been suggested that the phone number for the Venture School (see above) be programmed into cell phones in case of an emergency which would provide closer assistance until other emergency support arrives.




