From the Principal's Desk

Kia ora Koutou,

Greetings to parents and members of the Marotiri School Community

As Term 3 draws to a close, I feel it is important that we take a moment to reflect on, and celebrate, the achievements of our students (and staff) after what seems to have been a particularly long and somewhat unusual term. When we met as a staff earlier in the year to prepare a plan for distance learning packs, should we again find ourselves in Lockdown, little did we know that this would come upon us so soon.

Congratulations students, parents, staff, and community on the resilience and adaptability you have all shown while traversing Lockdown and the progression through Alert Levels, and what that has meant for each of you as individuals and for us as a school community.

Since returning to school at Level 2, we have focused on

re-establishing routines and providing structured numeracy and literacy learning programmes. For most students, a return to school based learning has been seamless, while for others there has been a need for support. We are aware that for some families this time has been challenging.

There will be interaction this Friday afternoon, which will be on the tennis court if it is fine, otherwise in the hall. As this will be our first full school interaction since lockdown and for covid health reasons we will keep this as student attending only.

There will also be a shared morning tea for staff, Board members and Room 6 parents this Friday at 11am to farewell Jill Simons who has taught in Room 6 while Michelle Fletcher has been on sabbatical this term. On behalf of the staff, students and Board, I extend my thanks to Jill for the wonderful job she has done. Please bring a plate and wear a mask when you enter the office

area. Parents attending are asked to wear face-masks, scan in and maintain social distancing. Please do not attend if you are unwell, or showing any Covid like symptoms.

Our Year 8 students who will be attending College in Taupo next year enjoyed an open day at Taupo-Nui-a-Tia College last week. It is exciting to see our Year 8 leaders preparing for their transition to College. Several of our Year 8's will be attending Boarding School next year. We will celebrate their graduation from Marotiri School at the end of the year. I do ask parents of students leaving our school at the end of the year to remind them that there is an expectation that they remain focused until the end of Term 4.

With the postponement of both the Kapa Haka festival and school production until Term 4, the context of our Art's curriculum has switched to preparing work for Ag Day. We trust that we will be back in Alert Level 1 by then and look forward to gathering as a community to celebrate this auspicious day. ourselves still at Alert Level 2, the Ag Day committee will make a decision about what this day might look like and you will be advised.

In the meantime, Toni Neve from Act II Visual and Performing Arts School has recently worked with classes to help develop scripts and sound-scapes for their performances in the School Production. We appreciate the expertise Toni brings to our school. Staff may call on parents and community members early next term for assistance with preparing costumes and stage props, so please think about how you may be able to assist. We look forward to celebrating our school's 60th anniversary with the production.

The Board of Trustees meet every third Tuesday of the month, with the next meeting scheduled for the 19th of October. We wish you all happy and safe holidays!


Room 5 Writing

I have a pet Taniwha. It has black and red patterns. He is a boy. He eats pears and bananas. Tomorrow he will be ten.



Marotiri School Community Survey 2021 Summary of Results

Many thanks to the 32 whanau who returned their completed surveys. The collated results show that most respondents are happy with what Marotiri School is providing for their children. For example:

- 91% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': their child is happy in their current class
- 94% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': their child is safe at Marotiri School
- 100% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': Marotiri School makes their child and our family feel welcome
- 100% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': their child's teacher cares about them and knows them as an individual
- 88% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': their child's learning style is catered for
- 84% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': Marotiri School supports all children to do their best including high-achievers
- 88% 'strongly agree' or 'agree': the school facilities are fitfor-purpose

Some of the survey results show aspects of our school that parents feel need more attention. These include:

- The perception that some student-to-student bullying is still taking place
- The need for more warning of upcoming teacher-only days and school events
- The desire for Marotiri to be included in more Taupo interschool events

At our August Board meeting, the results and all comments of the survey were discussed. We also thought about ways to encourage more families to complete a survey. Mrs Symes outlined all the strategies in place to discourage and deal with bullying. Nga mihi nui

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
