From the Principal's Desk

Kia ora Koutou,

Greetings to parents and members of the Marotiri School Community

Our learning programmes are off to a great start, with a school-wide focus on our Term 1 Inquiry – Ngã Huanga – Marotiri as an Enviro School. Students are familiarising themselves with our school grounds and discussing ways in which they can enhance and change our school environment so that it is sustainable for future generations. We look forward to sharing some of the innovative ideas.

Following the completion of our recent building and school painting projects, we are now in the planning stage for the landscaping of the entrance way leading to the school office. This is our final project funded through the Ministry's School Investment Package allocated for enhancing our school environment. We are grateful to Serena Waterworth for her landscaping expertise. We are now looking for donations of clean top soil and five large boulders approx. 1.2mt in diameter. If you are able to help, or know of someone who could, please contact the office. We are also looking for someone with experience in laying pavers to help create a new pathway to access the school buses.

Members of the Marotiri Trail Committee met recently to discuss plans for the 2022 Trail Ride. Given the level of support for last year's ride, we are excited to be going ahead with this event, albeit with some organisational changes to meet Covid requirements. Please mark 19th March in your diary and keep an eye on the Trail Ride Face Book page. Thank you to Colin and Dale Armer and their farm managers for allowing us to use their property. A huge thank you to Power Farming for being our major sponsor this year. Funds raised will be used for Teacher Aide Hours to support our learners.

As national Covid numbers grow, we continue to work within the

Ministry of Health and Education requirements. Classroom ventilation, use of masks for staff and students from Year 4-8, good hygiene practices and use of hand sanitiser all help ensure the safety of our students. The use of masks on the bus is mandated for Year 4-8, and encouraged for younger students. Phase Two requires us all to take increased responsibility for our own contact tracing. Therefore, it is essential that anyone coming on site (beyond the carpark) must scan in at the office, and for any parent having contact with students eg Breakfast Club, please scan your vaccination passport on your first visit.

The Ministry of Health have advised that the vaccination mandate for educational workers has been extended to include the requirement for a booster for all school staff or parents/volunteers working with students, within 183 days from the date of your second vaccination, or if that time period has lapsed, then 1 March. This includes parents attending school trips or camps.


If a positive case is confirmed at Marotiri School, we will follow the Ministry of Health guidelines and advise our school community as to whether groups of students and staff are required to isolate. Our staff are well prepared to deliver distance learning programmes if, and when, this may be required. The school will not close unless advised to by the Ministry of Health. Please remember to keep your child home if they are unwell, and we ask that parents do not come onsite if unwell either. Thank you for your continued support.

Accidents & Emergencies

The Marotiri District Defibrillator is located in a Red Cross box next to the entrance of the Hall on the school side. Please familiarise yourselves with this location.

The Defibrillator or AED is a self-explanatory device which could save a life if activated quickly enough.

Also, it is important to note that once you ring 111, you are 'locked in' to the emergency services and prevented from using that particular phone until the ambulance or helicopter arrives.

Therefore if you are on your own, you have 2 main options;

- Ring a neighbour or the school first (providing it's a school day) before ringing 111
- Or if possible, use 2 phones (cell phone and landline) as both can be used at once. This of course will depend on your location at the time, i.e. on the roadside or the farm or at home.

Tihoi Venture School has available an Emergency Kit that includes Oxygen, Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose, Nebuliser for asthma, Trauma Kit, Airway management and a defibrillator. All staff are trained First Aiders and can assist. Callum's contact is 021 029 31513 if no reply on 07 3728 416.

It has been suggested that the phone number for the Venture School (see above) be programmed into cell phones in case of an emergency which would provide closer assistance until other emergency support arrives.

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
