

Protection Against Measles

The Ministry of Health is urging New Zealanders to stay alert to symptoms of measles and ensure children between 15months-4years receive their MMR vaccinations. Measles is a highly contagious airborne virus which affects children & adults. It you think you have measles, phone your GP first before visiting your Doctor to avoid spreading the virus in the waiting room. The first symptoms of measles include a fever, cough, runny nose, sore and watery 'pink' eyes. This is followed by a blotchy rash. Vaccination is free.
