From the Principal's Desk

Greetings to parents and members of the Marotiri School Community. I hope you all managed to share some quality family time over Easter and are ready for a new and exciting term.

Thank you very much to our families and staff who worked so diligently to bring together our Cultural Celebration at the end of Term 1. Even the torrential rain could not dampen the spirits as we gathered together to share a wonderful evening meal prepared for 230 guests, followed by musical entertainment.

Food was prepared at school and cooked in two spits, two hangi kai cookers, a South African Braai, BBQ and at the Tihoi Venture School. The array of meats and vegetables, were supplemented with cultural dishes provided by parents. It was a wonderful celebration, only made possible by the generosity of our families in donating their time, meat and vegetables.

Protection Against Measles

The Ministry of Health is urging New Zealanders to stay alert to symptoms of measles and ensure children between 15months-4years receive their MMR vaccinations. Measles is a highly contagious airborne virus which affects children & adults. If you think you have measles, phone your GP first before visiting your Doctor to avoid spreading the virus in the waiting room. The first symptoms of measles include a fever, cough, runny nose, sore and watery 'pink' eyes. This is followed by a blotchy rash. Vaccination is free. 
