We are thrilled to have been successful in accessing additional Ministry funding to support our learning programmes. Writing and Mathematics facilitators are working alongside staff to further strengthen our learning programmes. The Ministry of Health is urging New Zealanders to stay alert to symptoms of measles and ensure children between 15months-4years receive their MMR vaccinations. Measles is a highly contagious airborne virus which affects children & adults. If you think you have measles, phone your GP first before visiting your Doctor to avoid spreading the virus in the waiting room. The first symptoms of measles include a fever, cough, runny nose, sore and watery 'pink' eyes. This is followed by a blotchy rash. Vaccination is free.
